We recommend the adoption of the ordinance found in "The Case for An Independent Police Accountability System: Transforming the Civilian Review Process in Rochester, New York." This ordinance abolishes the current Civilian Review Board and establishes a new Police Accountability Board as a separate department of the City of Rochester. This new Police Accountability Board will:

- o Hire an Administrator and Investigator who report to the Board,
- o Conduct investigations independently of the Rochester Police Department,
- o Have the power to issue subpoenas to compel testimony and evidence.
- Make findings to determine whether civilian complaints against officers are sustained or the officers are exonerated,
- o Make recommendations to the Chief of Police regarding the discipline of officers whose charges of misconduct are sustained.
